


## **About the Beehive Head Harness**

In the early 1920's, flattop head harnesses had been replaced by sturdier, more protective molded head harnesses at the college and professional level. However, in the late teens, Draper & Maynard introduced two inexpensive flattop models for beginner players, the 1H and 2H. Shaped like a hornet's nest, the beehive flattop was similar in design to the Harvard flattop, but had a quilted body that tapered up towards the crown. The D&M 1H head harness was discontinued in 1926. Similar economical designs were offered by other manufacturers, including the Winchester Repeating Arms Company, which became Winchester-Simmons Company in 1922.
