About the 8-Attachment Princeton-Style Helmet

Between 1929 and 1936 a new "Princeton-style" helmet was introduced by football equipment manufacturers. Similar to the earlier Princeton-style, the 8-Attachment Princeton had a lightweight design as was marketed for use in hot climates. Instead of a 4-point attachment, the lightweight leather crown of the helmet was sewn to the helmet body at 8 points at the headband. Most 8-Attachment Princeton helmets utilized foam rubber in lieu of wool or felt interior padding.

Distinguishing Characteristics
